Head Start Director's Report

November 2016

Enrollment:

The program has 85 students enrolled. The program is full with a waiting list of 99.

Community Outreach:

Family activity day was centered on Community Helpers on Nov. 4. The children dressed as fire fighters, policemen, chefs, construction workers.

The Strategic Plan:

The strategic plan is in place for the 2016-17 school year. Many forms are now accessible online.

Meals Served:

Approximately 1380 meals have been served in Head Start in the month of October.

Staff Trainings:

Staff attended an early childhood conference on Nov. 8 called "For Teachers by Teachers" held at Lakeland High School. Staff learned various classroom strategies and curriculum ideas from teachers in the field.

Parent Trainings:

Parents will attend a training on "High Scope Curriculum in the home" on Nov. 16, 18 and 22nd. Child led conferences will also be held on these dates.

Curriculum:

Teachers are continuing with the High Scope Curriculum and following the daily routine. The teachers are working on inputting COR and will share results with parents at child led conferences. Teachers are heavily focused on emotional literacy in the classrooms and are having children discuss, label and name their emotions. The "Mood Meter" is a focus building wide.

Monitoring:

No monitoring at this time-Our new monitor from OLHSA was here to visit and meet staff on Nov. 14.

Child Outcomes

Kindergarten readiness skills are a continual focus in the classroom: transitioning, conflict resolution, stamina, emotional intelligence and following directions.

Teachers are focusing on social/emotional skills, which based on current research, improves overall *outcomes* in test scores, reading, math and writing skills in the elementary school setting. This will be a building focus in the 2016-17 school year.

WHEREAS, the Waterford Board of Education has the option permitted by section 105 of the State School Aide Act of 1979, as amended by Public Act 300 of 1998; and

WHEREAS, it has the option, for purposes of sections 105 and 105c, to accept applications of nonresident students from outside the District, who reside in the Oakland Intermediate School District and/or a contiguous intermediate school district, which this district is a constituent district for the enrollment in our district for the 2017-2018 school year; and

WHEREAS, the Waterford School District has the option to operate a Schools of Choice Program in the Waterford School District for second semester in compliance with the statutory requirements of Section 105 and 105c; and

WHEREAS, the Waterford School District has outstanding school programs and there may be room for students from other districts to participate in these high quality schools, now therefore be it

RESOLVED, the Waterford School District chooses to participate in the aforementioned Schools of Choice Program for 2017-2018; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Waterford School District will accept applications for the 2017-2018 school year for the Kindergarten grade level (section 105) and grades 6-12 enrolled in the Cyber Academy only (section 105 and 105c) until the deadline established by law.
