One of the most crucial factors in a successful outcome is the immediate recognition of someone in distress, quick first responder action, and initiation of our facilities emergency action plan. Our guards take their responsibility very serious and the positive outcomes of their recent rescues are to their credit.

INFORMATION

MDE Cross Indicator Analysis and Timely IEPs

In accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), each individualized education program (IEP) within Local Education Agencies (LEAs) must be reviewed at least annually. In prior years, the Office of Special Education (OSE) has used data collected through the Michigan Student Data System (MSDS) to identify cases of noncompliance. This has led to an over identification of noncompliance in cases when multiple IEPs were held in one collection period. The OSE is in the process of revising and updating the MSDS to ensure districts have the capability of inputting the dates of multiple IEPs which occurred within a data collection period. This change will increase the validity and the reliability of the data as the OSE determines whether a student has had an IEP review at least annually. As such during the 2014-2015 school year, through a review of 2421 IEPs that were conducted by the Waterford School District, data reviewed indicated that two students did not have an IEP reviewed by their annual due date. To ensure that we maintain this high level of compliance, the District will conduct an on-going review of our policies, procedures and practices with the conducting and the submission of IEPs to the MDE.
