# **Enrollment:**

The program has 85 students enrolled. The program is full with a waiting list of 59.

# **Community Outreach:**

Our February parent activity was Dad's day. Dads learned about parent involvement and connecting through cooking. Dads and children made pizzas together. Dads and children took part in many activities including building, reading, and creative play.

Our March parent activity was Mom's and me with a focus on literacy. Moms learned about fostering early literacy skills in their children by reading daily. Each child received a book. The moms and children took part in many literacy based activities.

# **The Strategic Plan:**

The strategic plan is in place for the 2016-17 school year. Many forms are now accessible online.

# **Meals Served:**

Approximately 2350 meals were served in Head Start in the month of February. Approximately 2870 meals were served in Head Start in the month of March.

# **Staff Trainings:**

Staff were trained in Emotional Intelligence and fine motor skill development on our March 15 Professional Development day. Staff created "make and take" emotion jars for their classrooms as part of the activities that day.

# **Parent Trainings:**

Parents can sign up for Love and Logic classes beginning in March. Child care will be offered.

### **Curriculum:**

Teachers have completed the period 2 of the COR. We have seen growth in the areas of social emotional, approaches to learning, language, literacy, communication, math, science and technology. The "Mood Meter" is a focus building wide. Staff are focused on helping children recognize, understand, label, express and regulate their emotions.

# **Monitoring:**

Child files and classrooms were reviewed the week of March 13.

# **Child Outcomes**

Kindergarten readiness skills are a continual focus in the classroom: transitioning, conflict resolution, stamina, emotional intelligence and following directions.

Teachers are focusing on social/emotional skills, which based on current research, improve overall *outcomes* in test scores, reading, math and writing skills in the elementary school setting. This is a building focus in the 2016-17 school year.
