Dear Waterford School District Community,

We are pleased and excited to announce a wonderful new program for students who are academically advanced, beginning with the 2017-2018 school year. This program, Waterford Advanced Achievement Endorsement, will afford students the opportunity to earn an academic accreditation on their diploma which will be recognized on their transcripts for college admission as an advanced program of study.

Students who are interested should plan their future courses of study in accordance with the guidelines in the table attached, which have been prorated by graduation year.

The Waterford Advanced Achievement Endorsement program is based on the three pillars of Scholarship, Citizenship and Leadership.

Scholarship: Students will be expected to meet the requirements outlined in the table attached. Counselors at each of the high schools can support interested students in ensuring that their schedules will help them to achieve their goals. *By February 8th of senior year, students applying for the endorsement must have a cumulative, weighted grade point average of 3.75 or higher.*

Leadership: Students will be required to earn a minimum of 40 hours of community services by the end of four years. These hours will be prorated for the class of 2018, 2019 and 2020. Students will be required to provide verification of these hours to their counselor each year.

Citizenship: Students in this program are expected to behave as role models for their peers, and severe discipline infractions could jeopardize their standing in the program. These decisions will be made by administrators on a case by case basis.

Students who are interested should submit an intention form during high school registration. Intention forms can be found at www.wsdmi.org/advancedlearning. If students complete all of the requirements, they will be asked to submit an application for endorsement by February 8th of their senior year. 
