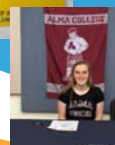
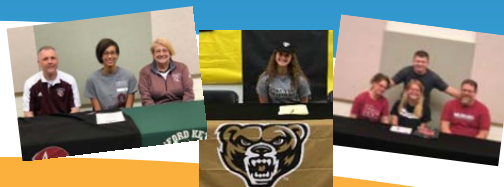
College Signings
