### **Student Expectations**

Students and parents are expected to know and be familiar with the Waterford School District Code of Conduct. Below are a few reminders about some of the more common issues that students should be familiar with.

#### **Dress**

Student dress is an important aspect to a positive and safe learning environment. Appropriate dress is expected by all students on a daily basis. Clothing deemed to be a distraction to the educational process will need to be replaced. Undergarments/underwear is not to be visible at any time. Pajama pants and slippers are also not permitted. Shirts should not have any reference to drugs, alcohol, sex, or foul and inappropriate language. Pants should fit around the waist and not “sag.” Shorts/skirts should be at least finger tip length when standing. A-tanks/tank-top t-shirts, worn by themselves are not appropriate. Shirts should, at the minimum, touch the top of the pants when standing. Bare midriff should not be visible. The chest/cleavage should be covered and straps over the shoulder should be at least 1 inch in width. Tube tops are not appropriate for school. Clothing that is worn too tightly may be deemed a distraction. Students may be required to change if attire is deemed inappropriate. Outerwear should be in the student’s locker during school hours.

#### **Hats**

Hats, caps, bandanas, hoods and other headgear are not to be worn at any time during the school day. This includes headbands. All headgear should be placed in the student’s locker during school hours.

#### **Backpacks**

Backpacks may be used to carry books to and from school; they should not be used during the school day and should be kept in the student’s locker.

#### **Cell Phones/iPads/MP3/PDA’s/Electronic Communication and Gaming Devices**

Electronic devices and headphones are not permitted to be seen or used during the school day. Any electronic device that is visible or that is being used during the school day will be confiscated by school staff or administration and may require a parent to claim it at the end of the school day.
