## Title 1 Right to Know

As a school with a federally-funded Title I program, parents at Riverside may request information regarding the qualifications of their student's classroom teachers. Upon request, the school will provide parents with information regarding:

- Whether your child's teacher has met Michigan qualification an licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
- Whether your child's teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which Michigan qualification or licensing criteria have been waived.
- Any degree or certification held by the teacher and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.
- Whether your child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

You may request additional information on the level of achievement of your child in each of Michigan's assessments.

You will also receive timely notice if your child is, for whatever reason, assigned, or has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks, by a teacher who is not highly qualified. A highly qualified teacher is defined as a teacher that meets Michigan's qualification and licensing criteria for the grade level or subject area in which the teacher is providing instruction.

## **Medications**

All Medications must be brought into the office by a parent or guardian. A form must be completed and filled out by your child's physician in order for medications to be given. Over counter medications must have a form filled out by a parent..

NO MEDICATION will be given to a child with out these forms.

Please do not send any medications (including cough drops) in students backpacks.

## **IMMUNIZATIONS**

Immunizations are required for children entering Kindergarten ages (4-6) and those entering 7th grade (7-18 yrs.). Requests for waivers must be certified at the Oakland County Health Division. Waivers must be submitted to the school office to keep on file.

The Riverside Office will be sending home letters to any student in Kindergarten or new to our district/Riverside regarding INCOMPLETE immunizations. It is required that all immunization are complete or a waiver on file. If your child does not have his/her immunizations updated and compete, they will not be allowed in school until the school is notified of the update.

## Blessings in a Backpack



Parents are BUSY people. Would snacks and meals that your child could safely grab on their own make your life just a little bit easier? Consider signing up for Blessings in a Back Pack. This is totally free to families who qualify for Free or Reduced Price lunches. The only thing required of you is a signed permission slip and your child would bring home a back pack of food and snacks every weekend. They bring the empty back pack to school on Monday (or Tuesday if they forget) and it's packed by volunteers all over again. This is discreet, convenient, and FREE. Our school has 70 % of our students eligible for Free or Reduced Priced Lunches, but less than 20% are taking advantage this stress free program. The convenience alone is a plus, let's not mention saving a little bit on grocery bills. Contact our school office or your child's teacher for more information and a permission slip.

## **Riverside Parents**

Please remember that school begins at 8:45. All students should be seated in the classroom at that time.

Tardies add up and may give students the feeling of starting their day behind.

If your child is going to arrive after 8:45, they need to be <u>walked in and signed in by</u> the adult responsible for bringing them to school

If your child is going to be absent, please call the attendance line at 248-674-5911. Please leave your child's name, date and the reason for their absence.

Please do NOT leave children unsupervised on school property. Students are NOT to be dropped off before 8:35 a.m. If you need to leave your children before 8:35 a.m., please enroll them in the Before School Care program so that no parent has to leave their child unattended.

Students are **not to be dropped off before** supervision time (8:35 AM). If you must drop your student and leave before 8:35, please see our Childcare staff for enrollment information.

## **DISMISSAL REMINDER**

Make sure all students are aware of how they are getting home daily. We understand that sometimes things change. Please remember that all changes in dismissal routine MUST be communicated to the main office NO LATER than 3:30 p.m. (2:30 on Thursdays) so that we assure the change is able to be communicated to the student.

On the *rare occasion* that a student needs to be picked up from school early, they *must be signed out be-* fore 3:45 p.m. (2:45 on Thursdays). After 3:45, all adults will be asked to wait outside for the student to exit using their regular dismissal routine.



#### Dear Riverside Families:

I am happy to report that Riverside will again have the opportunity to take part in the "Blessings in a Backpack" program, now in its ninth year in Waterford. "Blessings in a Backpack" is designed to support families by providing food for three meals a day for your child during the weekends. Students who receive free and reduced fee lunches are invited to take part. The program is sponsored through the generous contributions of the Community Foundation of Greater Rochester, the Meijer Corporation, Changing Places, local churches, businesses, and individuals.

Those who take part will receive a backpack every Thursday, filled with food for the weekend. The simple meals may include food like macaroni and cheese, beef ravioli, cereal, peanut butter, soups, juice and other items. Students return the backpacks each week, so they may be filled again for the upcoming weekend.

If you are interested, AND your child is eligible to receive free/reduced fee lunches, please fill out the form below and return it AS SOON AS POSSIBLE to your child's teacher or the school office, making sure that you indicate if your child has any food allergies. Then, look for the first backpack to come home in mid-September.

## Parents:

The following information is to help you know the chain of communication when you have questions or concerns. Please review it so that you save time getting to the correct people to help you.

#### How to Effectively Communicate with School Officials

Parents are often discouraged when they attempt to communicate with central office administrators and school board members and are sent back to building-based officials in order to resolve a problem their child may be experiencing in school. To prevent that frustration, parents can become informed about the "chain of command," or where to begin the communication sequence regarding their problem or concern.

Many parent and community questions are easily and completely answered by communicating directly with the educator in charge of the class or program. Each situation should first be addressed at whatever level the initial action was taken with appeals moving on to the next level on the chain of command. The easiest way to communicate is via e-mail, and a phone call is the next preferable way.



## **HOW TO GET STARTED**

#### NEW TO SAFESTOP?

Just follow these easy instructions to get the app.

- Search "SafeStop" on your Apple or Android device to download the free app. You can also access SafeStop on the web at www.SafeStopApp.ca.
- Select "Create Account", enter your information, and search for your school or district using your ZIP/Postal Code.
- Locate and select Waterford School District from the list provided.
- Enter in at least one valid Student ID to complete your secure registration.
- Do not know your Student ID? You can reach out to school administration.

#### RETURNING USER?

Welcome back! Now, let's get your account back online.

Log in to your SafeStop account then click "Reactivate Your Account." From there, just enter your postal code, select Waterford School District, and re-enter your Student IDs to successfully renew your account for the year.

#### SETTING UP YOUR ACCOUNT

- Once you log in to your account, select "Add A Bus Stop" and search using your home address. A list of routes with nearby bus stops will appear. Select the desired route and bus stop for your child's morning and afternoon bus stop.
- If you have multiple children, repeat this process for each
  of their bus stops. Tap the check mark in the top-right
  corner to return to your Account home screen.
- NOTE: SafeStop relies on information provided by the transportation department. Use the Report An App Issue feature to report inaccurate route information.

#### USING YOUR ACCOUNT

- Each bus stop features a Bus Locator button and a Scheduled Arrival Time. In most cases, an Estimated Time of Arrival will appear once we confirm the route is being performed as planned.
- The Alerts & Messaging Center is located in the top right corner of the app, which contains messages and updates from your transportation department.
