





Can you Benefit from Meals on Wheels?

What is Meals-on-Wheels?

The Meals-on-Wheels program provides a tasty, hot, nutritious noon-time meal to Waterford's homebound seniors. The program is based on individual nutritional needs, not income. The hot noon meal provides one third (1/3rd) of average daily nutritional requirements. Optional cold evening meals and frozen weekend meals are also available. Another benefit is a daily reassurance visit from our dedicated volunteer drivers. The Meals-on-Wheels program is administered by the Waterford Senior Center.

How does it work?

You may order meals to be delivered Monday through Friday between 10:30 am and 1:00 pm. A volunteer driver will deliver the meal right to your door!

Who is eligible for the meals?

- A person must be 60 years or older.
- Must be homebound; does not leave home under normal circumstances.
- A person must be unable to obtain food or prepare complete meals.
- The person's dietary needs must be appropriately met by the program.
- The person must be able to feed themselves.
- A person must agree to be home when meals are delivered or contact the program when absence is unavoidable.

What about the cost?

The meals are provided to you on a "donation only" basis. This means that it is your decision as to whether you can pay for meals or not. A \$3.00 donation per hot meal is suggested.

If you are unable to access the website, please call (248) 742-5172 and leave a message. An AARP Volunteer will contact you to schedule your appointment (after mid-January).

- The tax assistants are AARP trained volunteers, they are not accountants. Complex returns may be refused or out of scope. You are responsible for accuracy and retention of all information and tax records.
- For joint returns, both taxpayers are required to attend.

- PLEASE ARRIVE 15 MINUTES PRIOR TO YOUR APPOINTMENT TIME TO FILL OUT NECESSARY FORMS. YOU WILL BE GIVEN FURTHER INSTRUCTIONS, WHEN YOU ARE CONTACTED TO SCHEDULE AN APPOINTMENT.

Other options for completing your tax return include the following:

- If you have a refund coming, you can file your return within 3 years and still receive your refund.
- If you owe taxes, you must file by this year's deadline to avoid penalties.
- If you are eligible for the Michigan Home Heating Credit, you must file your claim by September 30.
- Prepare your own taxes online with assistance from AARP sign up at www.aarpfoundation.org/taxes
- Prepare your own taxes online using the IRS Free File program at https://apps.irs.gov/app/freeFile/
- Prepare your own taxes using a purchased software program.
- Prepare your own taxes manually using forms & instructions available at www.michigan.gov/taxes.
- Contact a paid professional tax preparer (we cannot offer any referrals or endorsements).






