The following preamble and resolution were offered by Member and supported by Member
<b>WHEREAS,</b> the Michigan Constitution states, "No public monies or property shall be appropriated or paid or any public credit utilized, by the legislature or any other political subdivision or agency of the state directly or indirectly to aid or maintain any private, denominational or other nonpublic, pre elementary, elementary, or secondary school;" and
<b>WHEREAS</b> , vetoed House Bills 5404 and 5405, and vetoed Senate Bills 687 and 688 sought to confer tax credits to be used for an unconstitutional, backdoor private school voucher program; and
<b>WHEREAS,</b> letters vetoing those bills pointedly stated, "Redirecting public school dollars for private gain is not only ineffective, it has been rejected by Michigan voters, with more than 69% voting "no" on a proposal that would have allowed the use of tuition vouchers for nonpublic schools," and
<b>WHEREAS</b> , in response to the vetoes, tuition voucher advocates have launched statutory initiatives aimed at circumventing a vote of citizens of Michigan to place those bills into law; and
<b>WHEREAS</b> , under Michigan law, the Legislature can bypass Michigan citizens' ability to vote on a statutory initiative that collects only 340,047 signatures from the more than 8 million registered voters.
