Advisory

Trails/ SEL

The TRAILS SEL curriculum supports students in developing five core social and emotional learning (SEL) competencies: self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, relationship skills, and responsible decision-making. Several TRAILS SEL lessons have been incorporated into our advisory program

W.E.B

WEB helps incoming 6th graders feel more comfortable and connected to the school environment through peer-to-peer mentoring from trained 8th-grade WEB Leaders.

The program empowers 8th graders to develop leadership skills as positive role models and contributes to a safer, more inclusive school culture by promoting connections and acting as a proactive anti-bullying measure.

EDP

The Michigan Career Development Model (MCDM) assures all students in gain necessary knowledge of district course pathways, the explore interests/talents and develop skills for success in a career of their choice and lifelong learning.

PBIS

The school's behavioral expectations, centered on the 3Bs (Be Safe, Be Responsible, Be Respectful), are clearly defined, consistently applied, actively taught, and positively reinforced for all students.

Advisory

We designed our Advisory calendar with a scope and sequence - just as we do with content-specific curricula. It includes PBIS lessons and key social-emotional skills.

Recognizing the 3B's: Our Positive Rewards



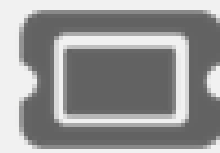
The 3 B's

We actively celebrate the hard work and academic success of our students who achieve All A and All B Honor Roll status each grading period.



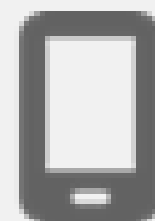
Golden Tickets

Our Framework for Support & Structure

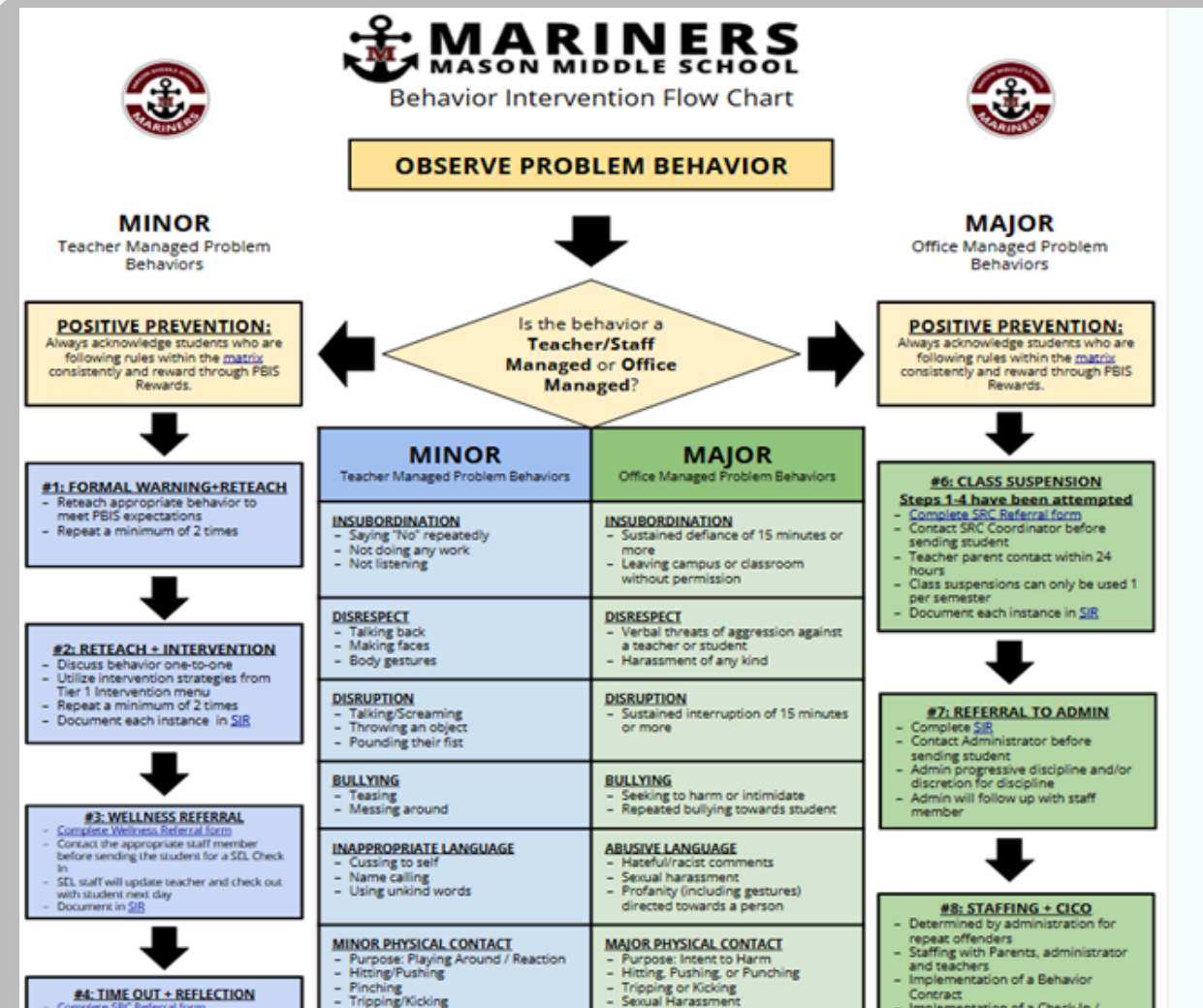
Behavioral Matrix

This is our blueprint for success. It shows exactly what the 3B's look like in every setting at Mason Middle School.

A clear guide for staff to respond to behavior consistently and effectively, distinguishing between classroom-managed and office-managed incidents.

Be Respectful	Listen attentively when others are speaking (teacher or classmates). Use polite language and a calm tone of voice. Respect the learning environment. Respect the diverse views and backgrounds of all learners in the classroom.	Leave the bathroom as clean as you found it (or cleaner!). Respect the privacy of others; Avoid lingering outside stalls. Catch-Up Cafe: A Mason Middle School Support Program

Program Overview

A dedicated academic support initiative to assist students who are failing 3 or more classes. This program provides a structured environment to help students get back on track and succeed.

3B Alignment

Mason's 3B Expectation	Catch-Up Cafe Alignment
Be Responsible	Students complete missing assignments, take ownership of grades, and seek help.
Be Ready to Learn	Students are prepared with materials and a focused mindset to work diligently.
Be Respectful	Students show respect for staff, the focused environment, and their own time.

The Catch-Up Cafe Process

- Identification: Admin & Counseling teams review a list of students failing 3 or more classes.
- Location: Identified students report to the Student Resource Center (SRC) at the start of their lunch.
- Dedicated Work Session: Students use the entire lunch period to complete missing assignments.
- Staff Assistance: A rotating team of School Counselors, Admin, and the SRC Coordinator provides support, tutoring, and guidance.

Returning to the Cafeteria

A student may return to the main cafeteria when **BOTH**** of the following conditions are met:**

- All missing work that contributed to the failing grades has been submitted.
- The student has direct confirmation from the relevant teacher(s) that they are back on track to passing.

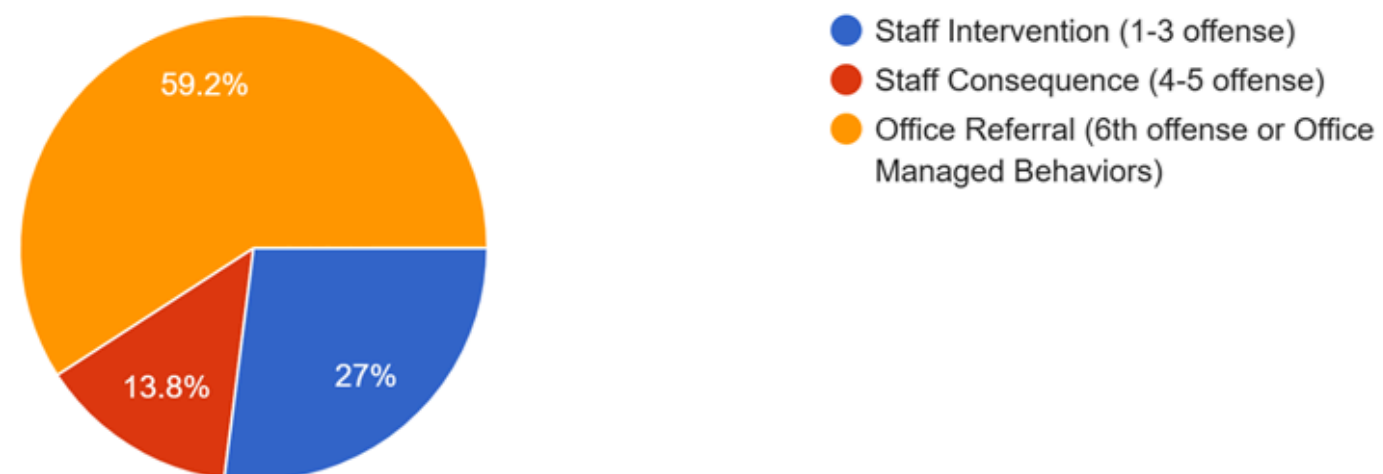

Since our initial implementation of PBIS in the 2022 - 2023 school year, we have seen a

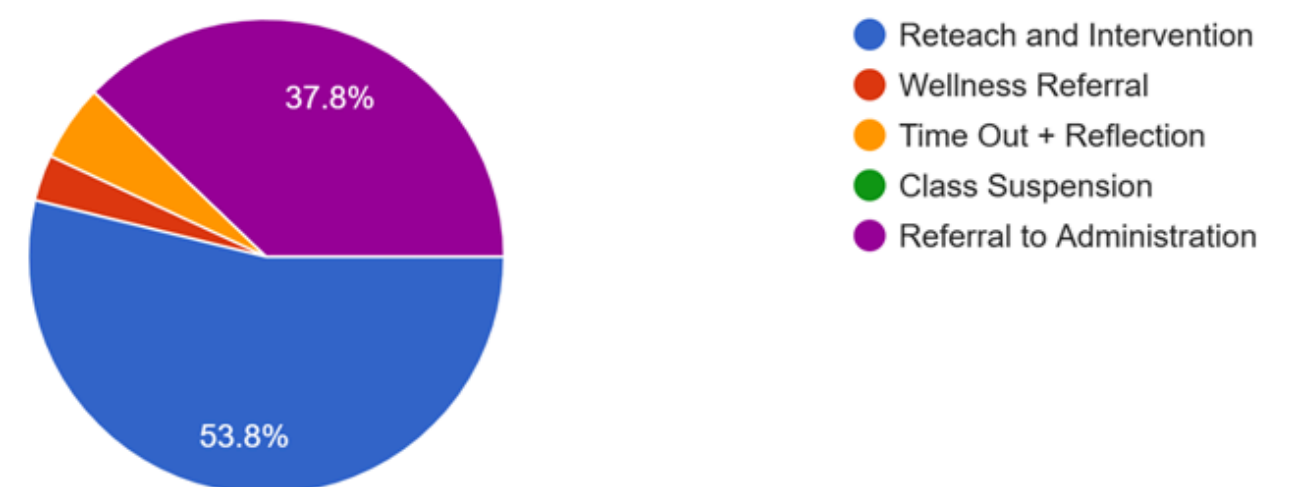
36% reduction of out of school suspensions and a
