

Dear WSD families,

The health, safety and well-being of our students, as well as staff and families is my number one priority. Because of this, I'd like to touch base with each of you regarding an area of growing concern in our school district – student vaping.

Numerous studies have shown the negative effects of vaping, particularly to our youth. According to the Oakland County Health Department, e-cigarettes/vapes are battery-powered devices that deliver nicotine, flavorings, and other additives to users by heating a liquid to produce an aerosol that is inhaled. They look like regular cigarettes, cigars, pipes, pens, USB sticks and other everyday items. E-cigarettes are also used to inhale marijuana, cannabinoid oils (CBD) and illicit drugs.

This is a reminder that, per Michigan law and our Student Code of Conduct, e-cigarettes/vapes of any kind are illegal in a school setting. Our students can be ticketed by our resource officers at any time if a student is found in possession of, or smoking, an e-cigarette. The current ticket issued for this violation holds a fine of up to \$175. There may be other consequences not related to the law, such as school suspension.

We encourage you to speak with your child about the dangers of vaping. You may find information from the <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u> and <u>My Life My Quit</u> as helpful resources for this discussion. Teens can also text "Start My Quit" to 1-855-891-9989 to receive free text-based help to quit vaping, if they are already addicted.

Thank you for your partnership in ensuring our students are drug free and focused on learning.

You will also receive an invitation from Google Classroom to join your student's Google Classrooms. This is a great resource to getting weekly parent updates. Be sure to accept the invitation when it comes to you!

Attendance / Tardies:

Being at school is the best way to ensure student success. **Every day counts!** Please make your best effort to ensure your student arrives in plenty of time for first hour, which begins at 7:20. The doors open at 7:00 each morning.

If your student will be absent, make sure you call the attendance line and let us know. If your student had a doctor appointment, be sure to have them turn in the note from the doctor and the absence can be marked as exempt.

Students are also expected to be on time to each class throughout the day. It is helpful if you can discuss this with your student prior to the start of the school year. Attendance calls will go out when students are tardy or absent. You can check MiSTAR Parent Portal to verify the specific hours your student was marked absent or tardy.

Electronic Devices:

We are so excited that each student will be issued a Chromebook this year on the first day of school to use for schoolwork! Please make sure your student charges their device fully each night and brings it each day. Students will be able to use their Chromebooks for academic purposes. Watch for the handbook regarding these devices.

Cell phones / earbuds / other electronic communication devices will not be permitted in the classroom. Each classroom will be equipped with a holder for cell phones and students are expected to put them in there as they enter the classroom.

Districtwide, students are prohibited from using or possessing active (i.e., turned on) electronic communication devices in restrooms, locker rooms, offices, and other locations where students and staff have a reasonable expectation of privacy.

Backpacks / Jackets:

Districtwide, students are expected to keep their backpacks and jackets in their lockers throughout the school day. This includes letterjackets. Sometimes classrooms may be cool. We suggest students keep an extra sweatshirt in their locker for this reason.

Code of Conduct:

Students are expected to follow the Waterford School District Code of Conduct at all times when they are on school property, at school events, or traveling to and from school.

Dress Code:

Students are expected to dress in a manner that is not disruptive to the educational process. Students may not wear anything that references drugs, alcohol, sex or violence. If a student is wearing an item that is deemed inappropriate, they may be asked to change their clothes or cover up any inappropriate item.

Waterford Kettering High School DECA chapter members earned the organization's highest honors as they represented Kettering at DECA's annual International Career Development Conference in Orlando, Florida,, April 21-26, 2023. Waterford Athletics Event Spectator Expectations and Guidelines

The 2022-2023 athletic competitions are underway! We appreciate our school and community support at our athletic events, and hope you enjoy coming out to support our teams! Our goal is to have these events run as smoothly as possible, so they can be welcoming and pleasant for all who attend. As such, our students and spectators will be asked to follow the updated event quidelines below:

- Student ID or a State Issued Picture ID are required by all attendees, except for elementary and children not yet of school age. Attendees will likely be asked to show an ID upon admission.
- 2. Middle school-aged students will be asked to show an ID and must be accompanied by an adult who is attending the event and remaining at the event for its entirety. The adult is responsible for the students who are in accompaniment for the duration of the event. Middle school students will be turned away at the entrance if they are not accompanied by an adult. Middle school students should remain in the immediate proximity of their accompanying adult at all times.
- All students are expected to follow the regulations outlined in the Waterford School District Code of Conduct
- 4. For stadium events- all spectators should remain seated in the bleachers keeping the courtyard near the concessions and bathrooms free from congestion. Spectators will be asked to sit in the bleachers or exit the stadium when not in line for concessions or the bathroom.
- Backpacks, bags, large purses, etc, larger than 6x4 inches, are not allowed; with the
 exception of a diaper bag when accompanied by small children, which would be subject
 to search. Footballs, other objects that can be thrown, open drinks, and any food, are
 prohibited from all events. Pets are also prohibited.
- Once you exit the event, you will not be permitted to return.
- Spectators should gather their belongings and exit the facilities within 15 minutes after any event. Our facilities will be closed and locked 30 minutes after the completion of any event.
- Refusal to show an ID when requested by any staff member, or failure to follow any other staff directives, will result in immediate removal from the event, and additional consequences will follow.


