Medicaid/Homeless Student

If a student has been homeless or from a family who has received Medicaid, there are college resources worth investigating.

Education and Training Voucher (ETV) <u>www.mietv.lssm.org</u>

Lutheran Social Services of Michigan provides funding to students who were in foster care on or after 14th birthday because of abuse/neglect or adopted from foster care on or after 16th birthday. These are just two examples of possible eligibility for ETV.

Tuition Incentive Program (TIP) www.michigan.gov/osg

TIP in an incentive program that provides tuition assistance to eligible students for the first two years of college and beyond. To meet the financial eligibility requirement, a student must have (or have had) Medicaid coverage for 24 months within a 36-consecutive month period as identified by the Michigan Department of Human Services (DHS). Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) <u>www.fafsa.ed.gov</u>

Students are strongly encouraged to complete the FAFSA and submit it January or February of senior year. By filing out the FAFSA, students will be considered for federal and state financial aid programs. FAFSA can be filled out online or students can receive a paper form by calling 1-800-433-3243.
