Easterseals MORC



Easterseals Miracle League of Michigan was founded in 2004, this is Michigan's first adaptive baseball field. There are two locations one in Southfield and the newer field in Orion. These fields makes it safer for players of all abilities.

Music Therapy

Music therapy is an additional service that is being provided to the students at our school this year. Music therapy is known to help the students discover the joy of self-expression through music, as well as reduce stress, improve communication, enhance physical movement and increase self-control. Our therapist, Katie Flynn, is contracted through FAR Therapeutic Arts and Recreation. Katie visits all the classroom in the school providing her therapeutic services. The students participate by experiencing different kinds of music during which time they have opportunities to play instruments and sing along with Ms. Katie. Teachers in the SXI program have noted the high level of student interest and engagement, while the students in the SCI program show that music might be the highlight of their day.



Art On A Cart

Our school received a grant that supplied us with a cart and many different art supplies. This grant was provided by Waterford Foundation for Public Schools. This cart can be used by various classrooms around the school, and provides them with art supplies on wheels.



Taking Care of Yourself Grant

Nurse Lumetta was awarded a grant through the Waterford Foundation for Public Education. This grant allowed Nurse Lumetta to put together personal hygiene kits for day treatment students. These kits included deodorant, toothbrushes, toothpaste, floss, shampoo, bodywash, and a travel carry case for all the products. Nurse Lumetta took the opportunity to reinforce lessons of personal hygiene for students; including showering, teeth brushing, and self care.

Mrs. Elliott received a grant from the Optimist Club of Waterford Township that she used to purchase a Tonie Box. A Tonie Box is screen free audio player, it plays stories, songs, and custom audio. The figurines called Tonies have preloaded audio such as audio-books and music.
